#### **CONSTRUCTION - PHASE ONE**

Construction of the Little Flower Spiritual Center is underway. The Center, which overlooks Lake Victoria and the city of Bukoba in Tanzania, is run by the Sisters of St. Therese of the Little Flower and will offer education and spiritual support for the surrounding communities. Additional plans for the Center include building a chapel, classrooms and a dormitory. Through your generous donations, STLF World Mission provided grant funds of \$12,783 for a well at the Spiritual Center.

## Sr. Pudentiana Kirungo Tibabyekomya Elected Superior General

On November 29, 2009, Sr. Pudentiana Kirungo Tibabykomya (Sr. Pude) was elected by the General Assembly to be Superior General of the Sisters of St. Therese of Bukoba and for a new congregation of sisters in Kayango. Sr. Pude founded the St. Therese of the Little Flower Orphanage in Burundi and has directed the construction of the Spiritual Center in Bukoba this past year. ### Divine Mercy Girls Hostel Purchased

Purchase of the Divine Mercy Girls Hostel was made possible this past year by a very generous donation of \$40,000. The Divine Mercy Hostel provides safe housing for girls from remote villages that attend school in the city. At the hostel the sisters are able to provide a safe environment that promotes spiritual formation.

Five of our children were baptized this past year.

When asked the question, "What do you want to be when you grow up?" the children answered:

> 5 priests, 5 teachers, 4 journalists, 4 farmers, 4 mechanics, 4 handcrafts, 3 doctors, 2 lawyers, 2 nuns, 2 engineers, 2 masons, 2 social workers, 2 medical professionals, 1 vet, 1 secretary, 1 soldier, 1 nurse, 1 architect and 4 undecided.
